

# Twenty-Second Sunday in the Ordinary Time

Matthew 16:21-27

# Reflection by: Gloria Huck

Today's Gospel reading is packed with what might be called the hard sayings: suffering, death, self-denial, the cross, humbling yourself, warnings against the lure of worldliness.

Peter is shocked when Jesus foretells his inevitable passion and death. This was not what he was expecting to hear. Just like Peter we seek the triumph of Christ, wishing to skip past the sacrifices and trials of the cross straight to the glorious resurrection. Jesus rebukes Peter, reminding him there is No Crown without the Cross.

Christ then invites all to take up the cross and follow Him. As our guide He freely accepted His suffering for our salvation, putting us first. We likewise must put Him first in our lives. We do not walk our way of the cross alone but with Jesus Christ-the Way, the Truth and the Life- as our companion. Along the way we learn the true meaning of love, which is willingness to deny oneself and sacrifice for the good of the other.

Lastly, Jesus reminds everyone that the worldly lures such as fame and fortune here on earth do not bring everlasting life and joy. To strengthen ourselves against the temptation of seeking worldly rewards above those that are eternal, we can cultivate the practice of holy gratitude. Our very life is a gift from God. We cannot thank and praise Him enough for all His abundant graces. Throughout the day, thank God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit for all the joys and also your sufferings.
