This month, the Church presents us with three feasts that focus on the glory of God revealed in our human nature. The three foundational glorious feasts are the Transfiguration of the Lord, the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary and the Queenship of Mary. Just as the Transfiguration of the Lord gives us a preview of the future when the Son of Man will come in glory in the Heavenly Kingdom, the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary shows us the goal of our own life pilgrimage. May Jesus and Mary inspire us to hope and persevere in the process of our own transformation to our glorious communion with God.

I cannot help feeling glorious and grateful that the AC/Heating unit has finally been installed on the second floor of the rectory. To date, donations total \$4,175.00 ... so we are still \$2,825 short of the \$7,000.00 cost of the unit. As such, we are still accepting donations for the full payment of the AC/Heating unit. My gratitude goes to all who made the Mexican Feast Under the Moon (Fiesta Mexicana Bajo La Luna) a roaring success. It was my first time to wear Mexican boots, Mexican belt and a sombrero! It was fun! Special thanks to the Servidores de Maria for organizing the fun-filled and colorful event.

Funds raised during the event totaled \$6,520.00 which will go into the completion of the grotto and the gazebo. As soon as these are done, we can next plan on the installation of our engraved pavers. Everyone is enjoined to submit names to be engraved, including names of your dearly departed that may be remembered in prayers at the grotto.

As school opens for the new academic year, the parish also opens classes for children preparing for their first reconciliation and communion and for their confirmation. I would like to thank the commitment and generosity of our teachers and teacher's aides. As I promised in the July newsletter, here are the names of our new teachers and teacher's aides. For the confirmation classes, the teachers will be Pamela Quiroz and Elizabeth Weiss. For the first communion classes, the teacher will be Olivia Campus and with Veronica Diaz as a teacher-aide. Patricia Giacomini will serve as our consultant and adviser. An experienced directress of religious education, I am profoundly grateful to Patricia for her help in preparing the lesson plans, materials and schedule of classes and her valuable advice for our religious education programs.

For now, seven (7) students have enrolled for our first communion classes and nine (9) students have enrolled for confirmation classes. Let us all pray for our teachers and students as we continue to teach and impart our Catholic faith and traditions to our children.
