

## 29<sup>th</sup> Sunday in the Ordinary Time

### Excerpt from the Spiritual Reflection of Pope Francis, Angelus Message, October 18, 2020

#### THE IMPORTANCE OF BEING FAITHFUL TO BOTH RELIGIOUS AND CIVIC OBLIGATIONS

This Sunday's Gospel reading (cf. *Mt* 22:15-21) shows us Jesus struggling with the hypocrisy of his adversaries. They pay him many compliments – at the beginning, many compliments – but then ask an insidious question to put him in difficulty and discredit him before the people. They ask him: "Is it lawful to pay taxes to Caesar, or not?" (v. 17), that is, to pay tribute to Caesar. At that time, in Palestine, the domination of the Roman Empire was poorly tolerated – and it is understandable, they were invaders – also for religious reasons. For the people, the worship of the emperor, underscored also by his image on coins, was an insult to the God of Israel.

Jesus' interlocutors are convinced that there is no alternative to their questioning: either a "yes" or a "no." They were waiting, precisely because they were sure to back Jesus into a corner with this question, and to make him fall in the trap. But he knows their wickedness and avoids the pitfall. He asks them to show him the coin, the coin of the taxes, of the tribute, takes it in his hands and asks who's the imprinted image is. They answer that it is Caesar's, that is, the Emperor's. Then Jesus replies: "Render therefore to Caesar the things that are Caesar's, and to God the things that are God's" (v. 21).

With this reply, Jesus places himself above the controversy. Jesus, always above. On the one hand, he acknowledges that the tribute to Caesar must be paid – for all of us too, taxes must be paid – because the image on the coin is his; but above all he recalls that each person carries within him another image – we carry it in the heart, in the soul – that of God, and therefore it is to him, and to him alone, that each person owes his own existence, his own life.

### Extracto de la Reflexión Espiritual del Papa Francisco, Mensaje del Ángelus, 18 de Octubre de 2020

#### LA IMPORTANCIA DE SER FIEL A LAS OBLIGACIONES RELIGIOSAS Y CÍVICAS

La lectura del Evangelio de este domingo (cf. El monte 22:15-21) nos muestra a Jesús luchando con la hipocresía de sus adversarios. Al principio le hacen muchos cumplidos, pero luego le hacen una pregunta insidiosa para ponerlo en dificultades y desacreditarlo ante la gente. Le preguntan: "¿Es legal pagar impuestos a César, o no?" (V. 17), es decir, para rendir tributo a César. En ese momento, en Palestina, la dominación del Imperio Romano era poco tolerada, y es comprensible que fueran invasores, también por razones religiosas. Para el pueblo, la adoración del emperador, subrayada también por su imagen en las monedas, fue un insulto al Dios de Israel.

Los interlocutores de Jesús están convencidos de que no hay alternativa a su interrogatorio: ya sea un "sí" o un "no". Estaban esperando, precisamente porque estaban seguros de que arrinconaron a Jesús en una esquina con esta pregunta, y lo harían caer en la trampa. Pero Jesús les conoce su maldad y evita la trampa. Les pide que le muestren la moneda, la moneda de los impuestos del tributo, la toma en sus manos y pregunta, ¿de quién es la imagen impresa?. Ellos responden que es de César, es decir, del Emperador. Entonces Jesús responde: "Por lo tanto, regrese al César las cosas que son del César, y a Dios las cosas que son de Dios" (v. 21).

Con esta respuesta, Jesús se coloca por encima de la controversia. Jesús, siempre por encima. Por un lado, reconoce que se debe pagar el tributo a César, para todos nosotros también, se deben pagar los impuestos, porque la imagen de la moneda es suya; pero sobre todo recuerden que cada persona lleva dentro de sí otra imagen: la llevamos en el corazón, en el alma, la de Dios, y por lo tanto es a él, y solo a él, que cada persona debe su propia existencia, su propia vida.
