Excerpt from the Spiritual Reflection of Pope Francis, Angelus Message, October 25, 2020

LOVE OF GOD AND LOVE OF NEIGHBOR: TWO SIDES OF ONE COIN

In today's Gospel passage (cf. *Mt 22:34-40*), a doctor of the Law asks Jesus "which is the great commandment" (v. 36), that is, the principal commandment of all divine Law. Jesus simply answers: "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind" (v. 37). And he immediately adds: "And a second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself" (v. 39).

Jesus' response once again takes up and joins two fundamental precepts, which God gave his people through Moses (cf. *Dt 6:5; Lv 19:18*). And thus, he overcomes the snare that is laid for him in order "to test him" (*Mt 22:35*). His questioner, in fact, tries to draw him into the dispute among the experts of the Law regarding the hierarchy of prescriptions. But Jesus establishes two essential principles for believers of all times, two essential principles of our life. The first is that moral and religious life cannot be reduced to anxious and forced obedience. There are people who seek to fulfill the commandments in an anxious or forced manner, and Jesus helps us understand that moral and religious life cannot be reduced to anxious or forced obedience but must have love as its precept. The second principle is that love must tend together and inseparably toward God and toward neighbor. This is one of the primary innovations of Jesus' teachings, and it helps us understand that what is not expressed in love of neighbor is not true love of God; and, likewise, what is not drawn from one's relationship with God is not true love of neighbor.

Jesus concludes his response with these words: "On these two commandments depend on all the law and the prophets" (v. 40). This means that all the precepts the Lord has given to his people must be related to love of God and neighbor. In fact, all the commandments serve to implement, to express that twofold indivisible love. Love for God is expressed above all in prayer, particularly in adoration. We neglect the adoration of God a great deal. We recite the prayer of thanksgiving, the supplication to ask for something..., but we neglect adoration. Adoring God is precisely the heart of prayer. And love for neighbor, which is also called fraternal charity, consists in closeness, listening, sharing, caring for others. And so often we neglect to listen to others because it is boring or because it takes up our time, or [we neglect] to accompany them, to support them in their suffering, in their trials.... But we always find the time to gossip, always! We do not have time to console the afflicted, but so much time to gossip. **Be careful!**

Extracto de la reflexión espiritual del Papa Francisco, Mensaje de Ángelo, 25 de octubre de 2020

AMOR A DIOS Y AMOR AL VECINO: DOS CARAS DE UNA MONEDA

En el pasaje del Evangelio de hoy (cf. *Mt 22:34-40*), un doctor de la Ley le pregunta a Jesús "cuál es el gran mandamiento" (v. 36), es decir, el mandamiento principal de toda la Ley divina. Jesús simplemente responde: "Amarás al Señor tu Dios con todo tu corazón y con toda tu alma, y con toda tu mente" (v. 37). E inmediatamente añade: "Y un segundo es igual, amarás a tu prójimo como a ti mismo" (v. 39).

La respuesta de Jesús una vez más toma y une dos preceptos fundamentales, que Dios dio a su pueblo a través de Moisés (cf. *Dt 6:5; Lv 19:18*). Y así supera la trampa que se le pone para "para ponerlo a prueba" (*Mt 22:35*). Su interrogador, de hecho, trata de atraerlo a la disputa entre los expertos de la Ley con respecto a la jerarquía de las recetas. Pero Jesús establece dos principios esenciales para los creyentes de todos los tiempos, dos principios esenciales de nuestra vida. La primera es que la vida moral y religiosa no se puede reducir a una obediencia ansiosa y forzada. Hay personas que buscan cumplir los mandamientos de una manera ansiosa o forzada, y Jesús nos ayuda a entender que la vida moral y religiosa no puede reducirse a la obediencia ansiosa o forzada, sino que debe tener el amor como su precepto. El segundo principio es que el amor debe tender juntos e inseparablemente hacia Dios y hacia el prójimo. Esta es una de las principales innovaciones de las enseñanzas de Jesús, y nos ayuda a entender que lo que no se expresa en el amor al prójimo no es el verdadero amor de Dios; y, del mismo modo, lo que no se extrae de la relación de uno con Dios no es el verdadero amor al prójimo.

Jesús concluye su respuesta con estas palabras: "De estos dos mandamientos dependen toda la ley y los profetas" (v. 40). Esto significa que todos los preceptos que el Señor ha dado a su pueblo deben estar relacionados con el amor de Dios y del prójimo. De hecho, todos los mandamientos sirven para implementar, para expresar ese doble amor indivisible. El amor por Dios se expresa sobre todo en la oración, particularmente en la adoración. Descuidamos mucho la adoración de Dios. Recitamos la oración de acción de gracias, la súplica para pedir algo..., pero descuidamos la adoración. Adorar a Dios es precisamente el corazón de la oración. Y el amor por el prójimo, que también se llama caridad fraterna, consiste en la cercanía, escuchar, compartir y cuidar de los demás. Y muy a menudo nos olvidamos de escuchar a los demás porque es aburrido o porque nos ocupa nuestro tiempo, o [nos olvidamos] de acompañarlos, de apoyarlos en su sufrimiento, en sus pruebas... ¡Pero eso sí, siempre encontramos el tiempo para criticar! Sin embargo, no tenemos tiempo para consolar a los afectados, **Tengamos cuidado!**


