Newsletter – November 2023

Dear Parishioners,

Blessings and peace!

This month ushered in the celebration of the Solemnity of all Saints and the commemoration of All Souls.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church Par. 954 states, "When the Lord comes in glory, and all his angels with him, death will be no more and all things will be subject to him. But at the present time some of his disciples are pilgrims on earth. Others have died and are being purified, while still others are in glory, contemplating 'in full light, God himself triune and one, exactly as he is." This teaches us the three "states of the Church" ... traditionally referred to as Church Militant (or Pilgrim Church), Church Penitent (or Church Suffering or Church Expectant) and Church Triumphant.

The Church Militant refers to us on earth, pilgrims journeying towards Heaven ... in pursuit of eternal life. Church Penitent refers to those who have died but need further purification in purgatory before entering Heaven. The Church Triumphant are those who have run their course and are now with our Lord in Heaven.

We may be physically separated from each other by the barrier of death, but we are all united in a spiritual way ... making up the Communion of Saints we profess in the Creed! We, the Church Militant pray for the intercession of the Church Triumphant for our own sanctification that we may someday join them.

Our Church has designated this month for us to specially pray and offer Masses for our departed loved ones. Those in Church Penitent rely heavily on our prayers for their purification and it is an act of charity to offer our prayers and Masses not only for our loved ones but also for those who have nobody praying for them ... the forgotten souls in purgatory. Let us all do so, recognizing the cycle of how the Triumphant Church helps the Pilgrim Church and how the Pilgrim Church helps the Suffering Church.

As the pilgrim people of God, we also need to help and pray for each other ... that we may overcome the difficulties in the current global situation that is affecting us all ... rising prices of food, gas and other things, including our insurance premiums.

Early this month, the fundraising committee met and planned for our next fundraising event to particularly raise funds for our Church roof. Our finance council also met and reported that our weekly collections fall short of our weekly and monthly payables. The finance council has agreed that we ask our parishioners to increase their weekly donations by 15% in order for us to continue to sustain our parish.
