SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT

Excerpt from A Spiritual Reflection by Pope Francis, Angelus Message, December 6, 2020

CONVERSION: DETACHMENT FROM WORLDLINESS AND THE SEARCH FOR THE KINGDOM OF GOD

This Sunday's Gospel passage (Mk 1:1-8) introduces the person and work of John the Baptist. He reveals to his contemporaries an itinerary of faith similar to the one that Advent proposes to us, who are preparing ourselves to receive the Lord at Christmas. This itinerary of faith is an itinerary of conversion. What does the word "conversion" mean? In the Bible it means, first and foremost, to change direction and orientation; and thus also to change one's way of thinking. In the moral and spiritual life, to convert means to turn oneself from evil to good, from sin to love of God. And this is what the Baptist was teaching, who in the desert of Judea was "preaching a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins" (v. 4). Receiving baptism was an outward and visible sign of the conversion of those who had listened to his preaching and decided to repent. That baptism occurred with immersion in the Jordan, in water, but it proved useless; it was only a sign, and it was useless if there was no willingness to repent and change one's life.

Conversion involves suffering for sins committed, the desire to be free from them, the intention to exclude them from one's own life forever. To exclude sin, it is also necessary to reject everything that is connected to it; the things that are connected to sin. And thus, we have to reject: a worldly mentality, excessive esteem for comforts, excessive esteem for pleasure, for well-being, for wealth. The example of this detachment comes to us once again from today's Gospel in the person of John the Baptist: an austere man who renounces excess and seeks the essential. This is the first aspect of conversion: *detachment from sin and worldliness*: commencing a journey of detachment from these things.

What can we do in these cases, when one would like to go but feels he or she cannot do it? First of all, remind ourselves that conversion *is a grace*: no one can convert by his or own strength. It is a grace that the Lord gives you, and thus we need to forcefully ask God for it. To ask God to convert us, that we can truly convert, to the degree in which we open ourselves up to the beauty, the goodness, the tenderness of God. Think about God's tenderness. God is not a bad father, an unkind father, no. He is tender. He loves us so much, like the Good Shepherd, who searches for the last member of his flock. It is love, and this is conversion: a grace of God. Begin to walk, because it is he who moves you to walk, and you will see how he will arrive. Pray, walk, and you will always take a step forward.

SEGUNDO DOMINGO DE ADVIENTO

Extracto de Una Reflexión Espiritual del Papa Francisco, Mensaje del Ángelus, 6 de Diciembre de 2020

CONVERSIÓN: DESPRENDIMIENTO DE LA MUNDANIDAD Y LA BÚSQUEDA DEL REINO DE DIOS

El pasaje del Evangelio de este domingo (Mk 1:1-8) presenta la persona y la obra de Juan el Bautista. Revela a sus contemporáneos un itinerario de fe similar al que nos propone el Adviento, que se están preparando para recibir al Señor en Navidad. Este itinerario de fe es un itinerario de conversión. ¿Qué significa la palabra "conversión"? En la Biblia significa, ante todo, cambiar de dirección y orientación; y, por lo tanto, también cambiar la forma de pensar. En la vida moral y espiritual, convertir significa pasar del mal al bien, del pecado al amor a Dios. Y esto es lo que estaba enseñando el Bautista, que en el desierto de Judea estaba "predicando un bautismo de arrepentimiento para el perdón de los pecados" (v. 4). Recibir el bautismo era un signo externo y visible de la conversión de aquellos que habían escuchado su predicación y decidieron arrepentirse. Ese bautismo ocurrió con la inmersión en el Jordán, en el agua, pero resultó inútil; era solo una señal, y era inútil si no había voluntad de arrepentirse y cambiar la vida de uno. La conversión implica el sufrimiento por los pecados cometidos, el deseo de estar libre de ellos, la intención de excluirlos de la propia vida para siempre. Para excluir el pecado, también es necesario rechazar todo lo que está conectado con él; las cosas que están conectadas con el pecado. Y por lo tanto, tenemos que rechazar: una mentalidad mundana, una estima excesiva por las comodidades, una estima excesiva por el placer, por el bienestar, por la riqueza. El ejemplo de este desapego nos viene una vez más del Evangelio de hoy en la persona de Juan el Bautista: un hombre austero que renuncia al exceso y busca lo esencial. Este es el primer aspecto de la conversión: el desapego del pecado y la mundanidad: comenzar un viaje de desapego de estas cosas. ¿Qué podemos hacer en estos casos, cuando a uno le gustaría ir pero siente que no puede hacerlo? En primer lugar, recuérdate que la conversión es una gracia: nadie puede convertirse por su propia fuerza. Es una gracia que el Señor te da, y por lo tanto tenemos que pedirla a la fuerza a Dios. Pedirle a Dios que nos convierta, para que podamos convertirnos de verdad, hasta el grado en que nos abrimos a la belleza, la bondad y la ternura de Dios. Piensa en la ternura de Dios. Dios no es un padre malo, o un padre poco amable, no. El es tierno y nos quiere tanto, como el Buen Pastor, que busca al último miembro de su rebaño. Es amor, y esto es conversión: una gracia de Dios. Empieza a caminar, porque es él quien te mueve a caminar, y verás cómo llegará. Reza, camina y siempre darás un paso adelante.


