### Reflection by Pamela Quiroz Mk 1:29-39

# Jesus said to his disciples: "Let us go to the nearby villages that I may preach there also. For this purpose, I have come."

Mark's gospel conveys a sense of urgency and immediacy in Jesus' ministry. Jesus had a sense of the people's great need to hear His message. This was displayed by the great crowds of people who followed Him to hear the Good News. He traveled to many places spreading the Good News throughout Galilee in villages, synagogues, and in homes. Throughout Jesus' ministry he prayed. Many times, Jesus went out into the desert to pray and connect with God. He taught his disciples how to pray. Jesus' ministry of prayer and healing is displayed in this Gospel.

This weeks' Gospel models our own modern-day ministry of Christianity through prayer. We usually move throughout the day with our own sense of urgency. Urgency that consists of our wants and needs. For example, our urgency to get errands completed, go to the store, or to complete tasks at work. Do we have that same sense of urgency to pray and connect with God? Do we pray only when it is convenient or when we want something? Or as Christians, do we learn from Jesus' example, and move throughout our day modeling what Jesus taught his disciples? Teaching others through kindness, helping, tolerance, patience, and prayer? Saint Paul's first letter to the Corinthians says that his goal was "to bring salvation to all." Christians spreading word of the gospel should be seen as a worthwhile ministry in our world of chaos.

Saint Paul's reflection about spreading the Gospel states, "All this I do for the sake of the gospel, so that I too may have a share in it." (1 Corinthians 9:16-19, 22-23)

### Mk 1:29-39

# Jesús dijo a sus discípulos: "Vamos a los pueblos cercanos para que yo también pueda predicar allí. Para este propósito, he venido".

El evangelio de Marcos transmite un sentido de urgencia e inmediatez en el ministerio de Jesús. Jesús tenía una idea de la gran necesidad de la gente de escuchar Su mensaje. Esto fue mostrado por las grandes multitudes de personas que lo siguieron para escuchar las Buenas Nuevas. Viajó a muchos lugares difundiendo las Buenas Noticias por toda Galilea en pueblos, sinagogas y hogares. Oraron durante todo el ministerio de Jesús. Muchas veces, Jesús salía al desierto para orar y conectarse con Dios. Enseñó a sus discípulos a orar. El ministerio de oración y sanación de Jesús se muestra en este evangelio.

El evangelio de esta semana modela nuestro propio ministerio moderno del cristianismo a través de la oración. Por lo general, nos movemos a lo largo del día con nuestro propio sentido de urgencia. Urgencia que consiste en nuestros deseos y necesidades. Por ejemplo, nuestra urgencia es completar los recados, ir a la tienda o completar tareas en el trabajo. ¿Tenemos el mismo sentido de urgencia para orar y conectarnos con Dios? ¿Rezamos solo cuando es conveniente o cuando queremos algo?

O como cristianos, ¿aprendemos del ejemplo de Jesús y nos movemos a lo largo de nuestro día modelando lo que Jesús enseñó a sus discípulos? ¿Enseñar a otros a través de la amabilidad, la ayuda, la tolerancia, la paciencia y la oración? La primera carta de San Pablo a los Corintios dice que su objetivo era "traer la salvación a todos". Los cristianos que difunden el evangelio deben ser vistos como un ministerio que vale la pena en nuestro mundo de caos.

La reflexión de San Pablo sobre la difusión del Evangelio afirma: "Todo esto lo hago por el bien del evangelio, para que yo también pueda tener una parte en él". (1 Corintios 9:16-19, 22-23)
