The Transfiguration of Jesus

Why did Moses and Elijah, of all the prophets, appear with Jesus at the Transfiguration? Moses lived in the 13th century B.C., 400 years before Elijah (9th century B.C.). Yet, both are important in the Transfiguration, because Moses represents the old Jewish Law and Elijah the Prophets.

Elijah serves as the greatest religious leader and prophet of his generation and ranks with Moses in saving the religion of the Hebrew God, Yahweh, from being corrupted by the worship of Baal (1 Kings 18), the Canaanite deity. Both Elijah and Moses have a vision of God on a mountain: Moses on Mount Sinai (Exodus 24) and Elijah on Mount Horeb (1 Kings 19).

Peter, James, and John were the inner circle of the group of 12, maybe because they were among the first to hear Jesus' call to follow Him, or they were the readiest to accept and understand the special revelation of his purity and glory.

The Transfiguration revealed Jesus' divine nature. God's voice exalted Jesus above Moses and Elijah as the long-awaited Messiah with full divine authority. Jesus is the fulfillment of the Old Testament law and the prophetic promises. He is not merely one of the prophets, but God's only beloved son.

To find out what they were talking about, we must refer to Luke 9:31. "They appeared in Glory and were speaking of his departure, which he was about to accomplish in Jerusalem".

"This is my beloved Son. Listen to him". We must not only listen to Him but emulate him in our everyday lives if we are to be worthy of calling ourselves Christians.

La Transfiguración de Jesús

¿Por qué Moisés y Elías, de todos los profetas que aparecieron con Jesús en la Transfiguración? Moisés vivió en el siglo XIII a 400 años antes de Cristo Elías (siglo IX a. C.). Sin embargo, ambos son importantes en la Transfiguración, porque Moisés representa la antigua Ley judía y a Elías los Profetas.

Elías sirve como el mayor líder religioso y profeta de su generación y se alinea con Moisés para salvar la religión del Dios hebreo, Yahvé, de ser corrompido por la adoración de Baal (1 Reyes 18), la deidad cananea. Tanto Elías como Moisés tienen una visión de Dios en una montaña: Moisés en el Monte Sinaí (Éxodo 24) y Elías en el Monte Horeb (1 Reyes 19).

Pedro, Santiago y Juan eran el círculo íntimo del grupo de los 12, tal vez porque estaban entre los primeros en escuchar el llamado de Jesús a seguirlo, o eran los más listos para aceptar y entender la revelación especial de su pureza y gloria.

La Transfiguración reveló la naturaleza divina de Jesús. La voz de Dios exaltó a Jesús por encima de Moisés y Elías como el tan esperado Mesías con plena autoridad divina. Jesús es el cumplimiento de la ley del Antiguo Testamento y de las promesas proféticas. No es solo uno de los profetas, sino el único hijo amado de Dios.

Para saber de qué estaban hablando, debemos referirnos a Lucas 9:31. "Aparecieron en Gloria y estaban hablando de su partida, que estaba a punto de lograr en Jerusalén".

"Este es mi amado hijo. Escúchalo". No solo debemos escucharlo, sino emularlo en nuestra vida cotidiana si queremos ser dignos de llamarnos cristianos.


