Spiritual Reflection Third Sunday of Lent

Covenant Relationship with God

Reflection by Fr. Lawrence Mendoza

A blessed 3rd Sunday of Lent to all! Today's readings invite us to reflect on our **Covenant Relationship with God** and remind us what it is that God wants for us and from us!

In our First Reading, God reveals the covenant relationship in the Ten Commandments. The first few commandments deal with how we are to relate with God, the last ones on how to relate with others. These are not to enslave us but to free us to be in closer covenant relationship not only with God but also with other people. The Responsorial Psalm praises the value of God's laws and commandments. The psalmist describes the results of those who keep their end of the covenant relationship and these are: revived souls, wisdom to the simple, rejoiced hearts and enlightened eyes. Moreover, doing the will of God is more desired than gold and sweeter than honey. Our Second Reading narrates the wisdom and strength of God's plan of salvation in and through the crucified Christ. St. Paul states that the message of Jesus is hard to accept by many, that this aspect of God's covenant relationship is beyond human comprehension. Thus, we are enjoined to understand it through our faith in Jesus and His death on the cross!

In today's Gospel, we hear of Jesus' cleansing of the temple, an account that is recorded in all four Gospels. During Jesus' time, worship at the Temple in Jerusalem included animal sacrifice. As such, there were merchants selling animals to worshipers and moneychangers exchanging Roman coins, which bore the image of the Roman emperor, for the temple coins that were needed to pay the temple tax.

Jesus' act clearly shows His unflinching determination ... to keep the house of God holy. It is not to be a house of trade, much less dishonest trade. Being in relationship with His Father, Jesus shows His love for the sanctity of God's presence among the people and His disgust for those who put restrictions on experiencing God's presence.

After clearing the Temple, the people ask for a sign of Jesus' authority to do such an act. Jesus' miracles are called signs, and the people look to these signs for proof of his authority. Instead, Jesus answers, "Destroy this sanctuary, and in three days I will raise it up." Not understood by the people then, Jesus is predicting His death and resurrection. And when it happened, Jesus' disciples remembered what Jesus had said. May we do the same ... and believe the scripture and the words of Jesus.

Yes, the ultimate sign people ask for is none other than Jesus' death and resurrection! On this season of Lent, let us reflect on the meaning of this sign for us and for our world ... and seek to deepen our **Covenant Relationship with God!**

Relación De Pacto Con Dios

¡Un bendito tercer domingo de cuaresma para todos! ¡Las lecturas de hoy nos invitan a reflexionar sobre nuestra **relación de pacto con Dios** y a recordarnos qué es lo que Dios quiere para nosotros y de nosotros!

En nuestra Primera Lectura, Dios revela la relación del pacto en los Diez Mandamientos. Los primeros mandamientos tratan de cómo vamos a relacionarnos con Dios, los últimos sobrecómo debemos relacionarnos con los demás. Estos no son para esclavizarnos, sino para liberarnos, para estar en una relación de pacto más estrecha, no solo con Dios, sino también con otras personas. El Salmo Responsorial alaba el valor de las leyes y los mandamientos de Dios. El salmista describe los resultados de aquellos que mantienen su final de la relación del pacto y estos son: almas revividas, sabiduría para los corazones simples y alegres y ojos iluminados. Además, hacer la voluntad de Dios es más deseado que el oro y más dulce que la miel. Nuestra Segunda Lectura narra la sabiduría y la fuerza del plan de salvación de Dios en y a través del Cristo crucificado. San Pablo afirma que el mensaje de Jesús es difícil de aceptar por muchos, que este aspecto de la relación del pacto de Dios está más allá de la comprensión humana. ¡Por lo tanto, se nos ordena entenderlo a través de nuestra fe en Jesús y su muerte en la cruz!

En el Evangelio de hoy, escuchamos de la limpieza del templo por parte de Jesús, un relato que se registra en los cuatro Evangelios. Durante la época de Jesús, el culto en el Templo de Jerusalén incluía el sacrificio de animales. Como tal, había comerciantes que vendían animales a fieles y cambiadores de dinero que intercambiaban monedas romanas, que llevaban la imagen del emperador romano, por las monedas del templo que se necesitaban para pagar el impuesto del templo.

El acto de Jesús muestra claramente su inquebrantable determinación... de santificar la casa de Dios. No es para ser una casa de comercio, y mucho menos un comercio deshonesto. Al estar en relación con Su Padre, Jesús muestra su amor por la santidad de la presencia de Dios entre la gente y su disgusto por aquellos que ponen restricciones a experimentar la presencia de Dios.

Después de despejar el Templo, la gente pide una señal de la autoridad de Jesús para hacer tal acto. Los milagros de Jesús son signos, y la gente mira a estos signos como prueba de su autoridad. Sin embargo Jesús respondió de una forma diferente, El les dice : "Destruiré este santuario, y en tres días lo levantaré". la gente no lo entendió entonces, Jesús estaba prediciendo su muerte y resurrección. Y cuando sucedió, los discípulos de Jesús recordaron lo que Jesús les había dicho. Hagamos lo mismo... y creamos en las Escrituras y en las palabras de Jesús.


