Spiritual Reflection Fifth Sunday of Lent

New Covenant by Fr. Lawrence Mendoza

A blessed Fifth Sunday of Lent to all! We are a week away from the start of the Holy Week. More than ever, we are called to reflect on the importance of the history of salvation ... a prophecy that became a reality in Jesus Christ during His earthly life, passion, death and resurrection!

Two Sundays ago, we heard God reveal His covenant relationship with the Chosen People in the Ten Commandments. Today, Jeremiah, in our First Reading (Jeremiah 31: 31-34), tells the people that God will establish a **New Covenant** relationship with them based not on laws written on stone, but one written on their hearts ... and on our hearts, too. A **New Covenant** that is the Good News which says, "I will forgive their evildoing and remember their sin no more." May this challenge us all to desire a renewal of heart and a closer relationship with God!

Today's Responsorial Psalm (Psalm 51: 3-4, 12-13, 14-15) is also a cry for a renewal of heart, a pure heart. Like the psalmist, let us ask God for His mercy and forgiveness of our sins and pray, "Give me back the joy of Your salvation, and a willing spirit sustain in me." And with gratitude, may the joy of the gift of cleansing inspire us to teach others to also return to God's ways!

Our Second Reading (Hebrews 5: 7-9) describes the relationship Jesus has with His Father! Here, Jesus teaches us two important aspects of our own relationship with God ... prayer and obedience. Reverently praying yet humbly submitting to God's will, Jesus exhibits confidence that God hears and is with Him in the midst of His agony. Such enabled Him to become the source of eternal salvation for all who obey Him. As God heard Jesus, so are we assured that God hears our prayers, too! Yes, in the midst of rough times, we can confidently turn to God in prayer knowing that God is and will always be with us.

Today's Gospel (John 12: 20-33) follows the raising of Lazarus from the dead, an important event which inspired many people to believe in Jesus. It also marks a turning point in Jesus' conflict with the Jewish authorities. Jesus realizes that His Ultimate Hour of Glory is imminent. Using the metaphor of the grain of wheat falling to the earth and dying so that a more abundant harvest might be produced, Jesus presents the idea that His dying would be beneficial. God will transform Jesus' death into new life not only for Himself, but also for others that they might live a rich and fruitful life.

Our Gospel ends with Jesus' confident response to the question He raises when asking God to save Him from His impending death. After announcing His conviction that it is for this purpose that He came, a voice from heaven, like the one heard at Jesus' baptism and at Jesus' Transfiguration, affirms that God welcomes the sacrifice that Jesus will make on behalf of others. Jesus adds that this voice was sent for the sake of those who would believe in Him.

As we approach the holiest of all weeks, let us all endeavor to reflect and understand Jesus' passion, death and resurrection ... and the salvation brought to the world, our **"heartfelt"** gift of the **New Covenant!**

Nuevo Pacto Por el padre Lawrence Mendoza

¡Un bendito Quinto Domingo de Cuaresma para todos! Estamos a una semana del comienzo de la Semana Santa. Más que nunca, estamos llamados a reflexionar sobre la importancia de la historia de la salvación... ¡una profecía que se hizo realidad en Jesucristo durante su vida terrenal, pasión, muerte y resurrección!

Hace dos domingos, escuchamos en las lecturas de que Dios revelo su relación de pacto con el Pueblo Elegido en los Diez Mandamientos. Hoy, en nuestra primera lectura de Jeremías;(Jeremías 31: 31-34), le dice a la gente que Dios establecerá una relación de **Nuevo Pacto** con ellos basada no en leyes escritas en piedra, sino en una escrita en sus corazones... y en nuestros corazones también. Un **Nuevo Pacto** que es la Buena Noticia que dice: "Perdonaré su maldad y no recordaré más su pecado". ¡Que esto nos desafíe a todos a desear una renovación del corazón y una relación más cercana con Dios!

El Salmo Responsorial de hoy (Salmo 51: 3-4, 12-13, 14-15) también es un grito por una renovación de corazón, un corazón puro. Como el salmista, pidamos a Dios su misericordia y el perdón de nuestros pecados y oremos: "Devuélveme la alegría de tu salvación, y un espíritu dispuesto a sostener en mí". ¡Y con gratitud, que la alegría del regalo de la limpieza nos inspire a enseñar a los demás a volver también a los caminos de Dios!

¡Nuestra Segunda Lectura (Hebreos 5: 7-9) describe la relación que Jesús tiene con Su Padre! Aquí, Jesús nos enseña dos aspectos importantes de nuestra propia relación con Dios... la oración y la obediencia. Orando con reverencia pero sometándose humildemente a la voluntad de Dios, Jesús exhibe confianza en que Dios escucha y está con Él en medio de su agonía. Esto le permitió convertirse en la fuente de la salvación eterna para todos los que le obedecen. ¡Como Dios escuchó a Jesús, también estamos seguros de que Dios también escucha nuestras oraciones! Sí, en medio de tiempos difíciles, podemos recurrir con confianza a Dios en oración sabiendo que Dios está y siempre estará con nosotros.

El Evangelio de hoy (Juan 12: 20-33) sigue la resucitación de Lázaro de entre los muertos, un evento importante que inspiró a muchas personas a creer en Jesús. También marca un punto de inflexión en el conflicto de Jesús con las autoridades judías. Jesús se da cuenta de que Su última Hora de Gloria es inminente. Usando la metáfora del grano de trigo que cae a la tierra y muere para que se pueda producir una cosecha más abundante, Jesús presenta la idea de que su muerte sería beneficiosa. Dios transformará la muerte de Jesús en una nueva vida, no solo para sí mismo, sino también para los demás, para que puedan vivir una vida rica y fructífera.

Nuestro Evangelio termina con la respuesta segura a la pregunta de Jesús que plantea al pedirle a Dios que lo salve de su inminente muerte. Después de anunciar de que es para este propósito que Él vino, una voz del cielo, como la que se escuchó en el bautismo de Jesús y en la Transfiguración de Jesús, afirma que Dios da la bienvenida al sacrificio que Jesús hará en nombre de los demás. Jesús añade que esta voz fue enviada por el bien de aquellos que creerían en Él.

A medida que nos acercamos a la más santa de todas las semanas, esforcémonos todos por reflexionar y entender la pasión, la muerte y la resurrección de Jesús... ¡y la salvación traída al mundo, nuestro **"sincero"** regalo del Nuevo Pacto!
