Spiritual Reflection 23rd Sunday of Ordinary Time

Jesus, Our Compassionate Healer

A blessed Nativity of our Blessed Virgin Mary! Yes, today is the birthday of our Blessed Virgin Mary but since it falls on a Sunday, we celebrate and read from the 23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time. Today's readings speak of God's love for all people especially the persecuted, the destitute and the mistreated, among others.

In our First Reading (Isaiah 35: 4-7), Isaiah encourages the exiled Jews in Babylon with the prophecy of their liberation and the healing of the blind, the deaf, the lame and the mute. Moreover, God will bring not only liberation and healing, but He will also bring water to give life to desolate and dry places. What reassuring words not only for the exiled Jews but also for us all that we have a loving and a compassionate God who will never abandon us!

Our Responsorial Psalm (Psalm 146: 7, 8-9, 9-10) reiterates God's being, a God who reaches out to the oppressed, the hungry, the captives, the disabled and the outcasts!

Likewise, our Second Reading (James 2: 1-5) challenges the members of the faith community in St. James' time and ours, too, not to show partiality to the rich. St. James calls on all to follow the example of God ... a God with a heart for the poor!

Today's Gospel Reading (Mark 7: 31-37) is a fulfillment of Isaiah's prophecy in our First Reading. Here we see God ... in the person of **Jesus, Our Compassionate Healer**. Jesus travels to Decapolis, a Gentile territory. There the people bring to Jesus a deaf and mute man and beg Jesus to lay His hand on him. Jesus does so and the man is able to hear and speak, a demonstration of Jesus' compassion for those who are suffering, Jews and Gentiles alike.

Not to be ignored is Jesus' manner of performing this healing miracle. Rather than simply telling the man to be healed or touching him as in previous healings, Jesus uses physical means like spittle and touch. Here we find clues about our understanding of sacraments. Today, we continue to celebrate the sacraments using physical means like water and oil in baptism, oil in the anointing of the sick and bread and wine becoming the Body and Blood of Christ. We are a sacramental people who believe that God's grace is given to us through these physical signs. True to the Gospel of Mark, Jesus tells the healed man and those who hear about the miracle not to proclaim what He has done. Sometimes referred to as the "Messianic Secret" ... this is the idea that Jesus purposely hid his identity as the Messiah. There are many debates on this but the most common explanation is that Jesus does this, so he does not get arrested and crucified before His time. But we also learn that the more Jesus orders them not to tell anyone, the more they proclaim it showing their astonishment of Jesus' healings!

We all know that **Jesus, Our Compassionate Healer** heals not only physically but also spiritually. Let us call on Jesus to heal our spiritual deafness that we may hear the Word of God ... and heal our spiritual muteness that we may speak of the Good News of our salvation with others. In gratitude, let us extend the same concern for the poor and needy, as God does!

Jesús, Nuestro Sanador Compasivo

¡Un bendito cumpleaños de nuestra Santísima Virgen María! Sí, hoy es el cumpleaños de nuestra Santísima Virgen María, pero como cae en domingo, celebramos y leemos desde el domingo 23 en horario ordinario. Las lecturas de hoy hablan del amor de Dios por todas las personas, especialmente los acosados, los indigentes y los maltratados, entre otros.

En nuestra Primera Lectura (Isaías 35: 4-7), Isaías anima a los judíos exiliados en Babilonia con la profecía de su liberación y la curación de los ciegos, los sordos, los cojos y los mudos. Además, Dios no solo traerá liberación y curación, sino que también traerá agua para dar vida a lugares desolados y secos. ¡Qué palabras tan tranquilizadoras no solo para los judíos exiliados, sino también para todos nosotros que tenemos un Dios amoroso y compasivo que nunca nos abandonará!

¡Nuestro Salmo Responsorial (Salmo 146: 7, 8-9, 9-10) reitera el ser de Dios, un Dios que llega a los oprimidos, los hambrientos, los cautivos, los discapacitados y los marginados! Del mismo modo, nuestra Segunda Lectura (Santiago 2: 1-5) desafía a los miembros de la comunidad de fe en el tiempo de Santiago y el nuestro, para no mostrar parcialidad a los ricos. San Jaime llama a todos a seguir el ejemplo de Dios... ¡Un Dios con un corazón para los pobres CT! La lectura del Evangelio de hoy (Marcos 7: 31-37) es un cumplimiento de la profecía de Isaías en nuestra Primera Lectura. Aquí vemos a Dios... en la persona de Jesús, Nuestro Sanador Compasivo. Jesús viaja a Decápolis, un territorio gentil. Allí la gente trae a Jesús a un hombre sordo y mudo y le ruega a Jesús que le toque la mano. Jesús lo hace y el hombre es capaz de escuchar y hablar, una demostración de la compasión de Jesús por aquellos que están sufriendo, judíos y gentiles por igual.

No debe ser ignorado, es la manera de Jesús de realizar este milagro curativo. En lugar de simplemente decirle al hombre que se cure o tocarlo como en curaciones anteriores, Jesús usa medios físicos como escupir y tocar. Aquí encontramos pistas sobre nuestra comprensión de los sacramentos. Hoy en día, continuamos celebrando los sacramentos usando medios físicos como el agua y el aceite en el bautismo, el aceite en la unción de los enfermos y el pan y el vino convirtiéndose en el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo. Somos un pueblo sacramental que cree que la gracia de Dios se nos da a través de estos signos físicos.

Fiel al Evangelio de Marcos, Jesús le dice al hombre curado y a aquellos que escuchan sobre el milagro que no proclamen lo que Él ha hecho. A veces conocido como el "Secreto Mesiánico" ... esta es la idea de que Jesús ocultó su identidad como el Mesías. Hay muchos debates sobre esto, pero la explicación más común es que Jesús hace esto para que no sea arrestado y crucificado antes de su tiempo. Pero también aprendemos que cuanto más Jesús les ordena que no se lo digan a nadie, ¡más lo proclaman mostrando su asombro por las curaciones de Jesús!

Todos sabemos que **Jesús, Nuestro Sanador Compasivo**, sana no solo físicamente, sino también espiritualmente. Llamemos a Jesús para que sane nuestra sordera espiritual para que podamos escuchar la Palabra de Dios... y sanar nuestra muda espiritual para que podamos hablar de las Buenas Nuevas de nuestra salvación con los demás. En agradecimiento, ¡extendamos la misma preocupación por los pobres y necesitados, como lo hace Dios!


