

## Spiritual Reflection 24th Sunday of Ordinary Time

### Difficult Yet Rewarding Path by Fr. Lawrence Mendoza

Today, we learn that the life of a disciple of Jesus ... that of following Him ... is a Difficult Yet Rewarding Path. It includes facing trials, opposition, persecution and even death yet it is the absolute path that leads to eternal life.

Today's Gospel Reading (Mark 8:27-35) is a turning point in Mark's Gospel. Prior to this, Mark has presented Jesus' ministry and His deeds showing Jesus to be the Son of God. But many, including Jesus' disciples, have not yet recognized Jesus' true identity!

In this Gospel passage, Jesus begins by asking His disciples what the people say who He is. Next, He turns the question directly to them and Peter answers, "You are the Christ!" Yes, Christ is a title given to Jesus meaning "Messiah" or the "Anointed One." On Peter's answer, Jesus warns them not to tell anyone about Him ... another example of Mark's concept of the "Messianic Secret" as we learned last Sunday.

On account of His ministry, Jesus also tells them what He has to go through ... His passion, death and resurrection. Peter rejects this as it is not the image of a Messiah that Peter is expecting. Jesus rebukes Peter severely. He then summons the crowd with His disciples and teaches them about the path of discipleship: Jesus' disciple must be willing to deny himself, take up his cross and follow Him. The path that Jesus is inviting His disciples to take means tremendous suffering and sacrifice, even death on the cross.

On the Book of the Prophet Isaiah, it is important to note that Isaiah is often called the "Messianic Prophet" because of his prophecy of the birth of the Messiah who would redeem the people from their sins. Moreover, Isaiah's four Songs of the "Suffering Servant" are direct prophetic revelations of the passion, death and resurrection of the Messiah, that is Jesus!

Our First Reading (Isaiah 50:5-9) is the third Song of the "Suffering Servant." Here, Isaiah presents a clear description and prophecy of Jesus the Messiah ... not as a political leader who will save the Jewish people from Roman occupation but as one who will save His people through His own personal suffering. It is important to point out that the "Suffering Servant" endures the rejection and physical abuse inflicted on Him, fully entrusting His vindication in God's hands. In the words of Isaiah, "See, the Lord God is my help; who will prove me wrong?"

Thus, we also read this same passage (Isaiah 50:5-9) every Palm Sunday, the start of Holy Week, to give us an understanding of Jesus' journey to resurrection through His death on the cross.

As Jesus called His disciples then, so are we all called now to take on our respective roles in continuing His ministry! Let us all heed the call knowing that even if we are ridiculed and possibly persecuted, God is with us to help us get through the Difficult Yet Rewarding Path.

### Camino Difícil, Pero Gratificante Por el Padre Lawrence Mendoza

Hoy aprendemos que la vida de un discípulo de Jesús... el seguirlo... es un Camino Difícil Pero Gratificante. Incluye enfrentar juicios, oposición, persecución e incluso la muerte, pero es el camino absoluto que conduce a la vida eterna.

La lectura del Evangelio de hoy (Marcos 8:27-35) es un punto de inflexión en el Evangelio. Antes de esto, Marcos ha presentado el ministerio de Jesús y sus hazañas mostrando a Jesús como el Hijo de Dios. ¡Pero muchos, incluidos los discípulos de Jesús, aún no han reconocido la verdadera identidad de Jesús!

En este pasaje del Evangelio, Jesús comienza preguntando a sus discípulos qué es lo que dice la gente quién es. A continuación, Él dirige la pregunta directamente a ellos y Pedro responde: "¡Tú eres el Cristo!" Sí, Cristo es un título dado a Jesús que significa "Mesías" o el "Ungido". En la respuesta de Pedro, Jesús les advierte que no le cuenten a nadie sobre Él... otro ejemplo del concepto de Marco del "Secreto Mesiánico" como aprendimos el domingo pasado.

Debido a su ministerio, Jesús también les dice por lo que tiene que pasar... Su pasión, muerte y resurrección. Peter rechaza esto porque no es la imagen de un Mesías lo que Peter está esperando. Jesús reprende severamente a Pedro. Después convoca a la multitud con sus discípulos y les enseña sobre el camino del discipulado: el discípulo de Jesús debe estar dispuesto a negarse a sí mismo, tomar su cruz y seguirlo. El camino que Jesús está invitando a sus discípulos a tomar significa un tremendo sufrimiento y sacrificio, incluso la muerte en la cruz.

En el Libro del Profeta Isaías, es importante señalar que Isaías a menudo se le llama el "Profeta Mesiánico" debido a su profecía del nacimiento del Mesías que redimiría al pueblo de sus pecados. Además, las cuatro canciones de Isaías del "Siervo Sufriente" son revelaciones proféticas directas de la pasión, la muerte y la resurrección del Mesías, ¡es decir, Jesús!

Nuestra Primera Lectura (Isaías 50:5-9) es la tercera Canción del "Siervo Sufriente". Aquí, Isaías presenta una clara descripción y profecía de Jesús el Mesías... no como un líder político que salvará al pueblo judío de la ocupación romana, sino como alguien que salvará a su pueblo a través de su propio sufrimiento personal. Es importante señalar que el "Siervo sufriente" soporta el rechazo y el abuso físico infligido a Él, confiando plenamente su reivindicación en manos de Dios. En palabras de Isaías: "Mira, el Señor Dios es mi ayuda; ¿quién me demostrará que estoy equivocado?"

Por lo tanto, también leemos este mismo pasaje (Isaías 50:5-9) cada Domingo de Ramos, el comienzo de la Semana Santa, para darnos una comprensión del viaje de Jesús a la resurrección a través de Su muerte en la cruz.

Como Jesús llamó a sus discípulos entonces, ¡así todos estamos llamados ahora a asumir nuestros respectivos roles en la continuación de su ministerio! Escuchemos todos la llamada sabiendo que incluso si somos ridiculizados y posiblemente perseguidos, Dios está con nosotros para ayudarnos a atravesar el Camino Difícil Pero Gratificante.


