

# Servanthood, Suffering and Redemption by Fr. Lawrence Mendoza

Today's Gospel Reading (Mark 10:35-45) describes a critical point in the lives of Jesus' inner circle composed of twelve disciples He personally chose. Jesus has just informed them, for the third time, of His impending suffering and death and were on their way to Jerusalem where Jesus is to face His passion and death. But the twelve disciples do not understand His Messiahship, still believing that Jesus is going to establish an earthly realm where they will share in His power and hold positions of honor.

Thus today, we hear James and John (two of the twelve) approach Jesus with this request, "Grant that in your glory we may sit one at your right and the other at your left." Knowing that James and John are oblivious of what they are asking for, Jesus tells them that their request is not His to give. Mark narrates that even if the request was denied, the fact that the two approached Jesus with such a request resulted to the indignation of the other ten disciples towards the two. This reveals that perhaps each one of them has the same ambition to be the first over the other. In fact, a few Sundays ago, St. Mark did narrate an argument the twelve had as to who among them was the greatest.

Jesus takes this opportunity to again teach His inner circle of disciples about **Servanthood**, **Suffering and Redemption**. He summons them and says, "Whoever wishes to be great among you will be your servant; whoever wishes to be first among you will be the slave of all. For the Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many."

Jesus is bringing home the point that His Messiahship is not one of being honored and served as one in authority, but one of serving and saving others through His ministry, suffering and death. That is, our Gospel Reading explains how Jesus is to accomplish His mission of saving mankind from the slavery of sin through His passion and death. Jesus is preparing His twelve disciples for their future mission of continuing His ministry!

Today's Gospel is undoubtedly a fulfilment of Isaiah's prophecy in our First Reading (Isaiah 53:10-11), which is a part of the Fourth Servant Song in the Book of the Prophet Isaiah. It is a Messianic prophecy that speaks of how the Servant of God will save mankind by sacrificing himself as the atonement for our sins.

The suffering of the Servant is definitely God's will and plan as it states, "The Lord was pleased to crush him in infirmity." Pleased, not in the suffering but in the purpose of the Servant's suffering ... which will lead to the justification for many and ultimate glory for the Servant.

Yes, Jesus is the "Suffering Servant." Jesus demonstrates the Divine Love for us by coming as the Messiah who is truly the "Suffering Servant." In gratitude, let us open our hearts to the Holy Spirit to strengthen and motivate us to heed Jesus' teachings on **Servanthood**, **Suffering and Redemption** … and give our lives in the loving service to others!
