

Faith and Deliverance by Fr. Lawrence Mendoza

In our First Reading (Jeremiah 31:7-9), God speaks through Jeremiah calling on the people to rejoice on account of what God will do for the exiled people. God is bringing them back to their own land. That is, the people are not returning home on their own but on Divine deliverance. Moreover, it states that the "remnant of Israel" are the ones being delivered. More than the fact that "remnant" here may refer to the survivors as some may have died while on exile, "remnant" may more appropriately refer to those who remained faithful to God. This is definitely something that we may reflect on, to have **Faith and** gain **Deliverance** from any form of bondage!

Yes, our Lord will gather His people from the ends of the world, with the blind and the lame, the mothers and those with child. Jeremiah is silent on the Lord changing their bodies but assures them that He will lead them to brooks of water and on level road so that none shall stumble! So, reassuring!

Our Responsorial Psalm (Psalm 126:1-2, 2-3, 4-5, 6) describes how happy the exiles were when the Lord brought them back to Zion. In their joy, they tell other nations of God's greatness to them. Perhaps, God is not asking us to just live on the great memories of the past. Our Responsorial Psalm also teaches us to prepare for a greater hope and states, "Those that sow in tears shall reap rejoicing." God has not just done great things for us, He also promises us that amidst sorrow in life, we are on our way to unending joy! Have **Faith and** gain **Deliverance** from misfortunes!

The Second Reading (Hebrews 5:1-6) tells us that all high priests are called by God, giving them the legitimate claim to their priestly duties. In the same way, Jesus was also called by God saying, "You are a priest forever according to the order of Melchizedek." We do not only learn that Jesus' appointment will never end, but we also get to realize that Jesus, having been glorified by God as His Son, will Himself become the Sacrifice.

The Gospel Reading (Mark 10:46-52) starts with Jesus about to make His entrance into Jerusalem to be the perfect High Priest and perfect Victim. Notably, He is in Jericho, the gateway city through which the Israelites came when they entered the Promised Land.

When the blind man, Bartimaeus, hears that Jesus of Nazareth is passing by, he calls out, "Jesus, son of David, have pity on me." The crowd tries to silence and rebuke him, but Bartimaeus persists. We notice how quickly the crowd's reaction changes when Jesus calls for Bartimaeus. Those who sought to quiet him now say, "Take courage; get up, Jesus is calling you." Jesus restores Bartimaeus' sight without elaborate actions. Jesus simply says, "Go your way; your faith has saved you."

Throughout Mark's Gospel, the success of Jesus' healing power has often been linked with the faith of the person requesting Jesus' help. We know of a woman with the hemorrhage being healed because of her faith. We also know of Jesus not being able to heal in Nazareth due to the absence of faith by the people there.

On Bartimaeus' healing, he follows Jesus on his way to Jerusalem, becoming the last disciple called by Jesus before entering Jerusalem. Clearly, Jesus does not only bring physical healing, but He also brings spiritual healing. Let us learn from Bartimaeus ... profess our **Faith**, get through Jericho spiritually healed ... **and** follow Jesus to our spiritual **Deliverance**!
