Newsletter - October 2024

Dear Parishioners,

Blessings!

The month of October is dedicated to the Holy Rosary and there was no better way to celebrate the month than to pray the Rosary. I trust that we all did!

Last October 7, we celebrated the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary. This year, Pope Francis called us all to pray the Rosary and fast on this day for peace in the world. A timely call considering the on-going wars and conflicts in various parts of the world! And so apt, considering the significance of October 7, the day in 1571, when Catholic naval forces won the Battle of Lepanto. The Catholic forces were outnumbered and the Pope then, St. Pope Pius V, called for all of Europe to pray the Rosary. The victory, is evidence of the Hand of God working through Our Lady, prevented the Islamic invasion of Europe!

Initially, the day was celebrated liturgically as Our Lady of Victory. Later, it was renamed Our Lady of the Rosary and extended throughout the Universal Church. Notably at Fatima, Our Lady introduced herself to the children, "I am the Lady of the Rosary." Our Lady taught the children how to pray the Rosary and to pray it every day ... to bring peace and end a "great war." Following the teaching at Fatima, let us pray the Rosary every day not only in October, but always ... and ask the powerful intercession of Our Lady for the end of wars and for the beginning of peace. Peace in our hearts, our homes and in the whole world!

Moving earlier to the 1st day of October, we celebrated the Feast of Saint Therese of the Child Jesus and the Holy Face, also popularly known as the Little Flower. She entered the contemplative Carmelites at age 15. When asked at her canonical examination why she joined, she answered, "I came to save souls and especially to pray for priests." And she did so as a "spiritual sister" to some priests ... communicating with them only through letters, praying and offering sacrifices for their missionary work. She had wanted to be a missionary herself but her poor health prevented her from being one. A missionary at heart, she died at a young age of 24.

It is no surprise that St. Therese became a patron saint of missions and missionaries and in fact the month of October is also dedicated to Missions. The mission period always starts on October 1, on the Feast of St. Therese and ends on the penultimate Sunday of October. Thus, this year, we ended it last October 20 with the World Mission Sunday.

As many of you know, I was ordained a priest on October 12, 2012, making the month of October very special to me. My heartfelt thanks to all who attended my 12th year anniversary Thanksgiving Mass. Thank you for being part of this sacred journey. I cannot help but reflect on Jesus' words last October 13, "Amen, I say to you, there is no one who has given up house or brothers or sisters or mother or father or children or lands for my sake and for the sake of the gospel who will not receive a hundred times more now in this present age ..." What I gave up when I left home to become a priest had been returned to me a hundred times more through all of you ... a community of families I am treated to be a part of. Thank you all for being God's blessings to me!
