

Spiritual Reflection - Third Sunday of Advent

Rejoice in the Lord Always by Fr. Lawrence Mendoza

The 3rd Sunday of Advent is also called Gaudete Sunday. Gaudete is a Latin word that means rejoice and today's Entrance Antiphon clearly proclaims the calling and the sentiment of today's mass: "**Rejoice in the Lord Always**; again, I say, rejoice. Indeed, the Lord is near!" Thus, we mark this Sunday by lighting not a purple candle but a pink one on the Advent wreath as a symbol of joy because our salvation is at hand!

In our First Reading (Zephaniah 3:14-18a), Zephaniah speaks in "prophetic past" and says with certainty what is predicted in the future. He tells the people of Jerusalem to rejoice because the Lord has removed the judgment against them and has turned away their enemies. They can thus lay their fear aside because the Lord is in their midst. Moreover, it states that the Lord God will rejoice over the people and will dwell in intimate love and fellowship with them.

The Responsorial Psalm (Isaiah 12:2-3, 4, 5-6) is likewise a joyful exhortation of the Lord's coming. Isaiah describes the future when Israel will rejoice and praise the Lord for bringing them hope and salvation. They will see that He alone is their salvation, and they will proclaim His glory to all nations.

In our Second Reading (Philippians 4:4-7), Paul calls the Philippians to "**Rejoice in the Lord Always**. I shall say it again: rejoice! ... The Lord is near." Yes, these are the very same words from Paul that we hear in our Entrance Antiphon! Paul is advising the Philippians and us, too, to have no anxiety at all. That is, Paul is telling us to bring our anxieties and worries to God, who alone is able to give us peace. Peace that is beyond understanding!

Our Gospel Reading (Luke 3:10-18) continues last week's focus on John the Baptist and his role in preparing the way for Christ. It presents the message of John the Baptist that is primarily a call for repentance but also implies a message of joyful expectation of the coming of the Lord!

The crowds ask John the Baptist what they need to do, and he gives them concrete actions like: acts of charity by sharing a cloak and food; honesty by not collecting more than what is required; and social justice by not falsely accusing anyone and being satisfied with one's wages.

When the crowds begin to wonder if John the Baptist might be the Messiah, John informs them that his ministry of baptism is in preparation for the Messiah. He then announces that One who is mightier than him is coming and that He will baptize them with the Holy Spirit and fire.

We have a lot of reasons to rejoice, indeed! It is not only the joyous celebration of the birth of Jesus ten days from today ... it is also the awareness that Jesus is amidst us and in fact, comes to us repeatedly and always through the Holy Eucharist and the Sacraments. More importantly, the rejoicing we are called to do must be reflected in our way of life ... a life that joyfully demonstrates our readiness for when Jesus might call us Home to be with Him and the Father whenever it might be!

Yes, let us **Rejoice in the Lord Always** that through our example, others may rejoice as well!
