# Spiritual Reflection – Second Sunday of Advent

#### Hoping and Longing for the Coming of Jesus by Fr. Lawrence Mendoza

On this 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of Advent, we continue with the theme of the "Coming" of the Lord Jesus.

The Book of the Prophet Baruch may be a bit controversial in the sense that the earliest known manuscripts are in Greek. However, most if not all of Bible scholars believe that there is a Hebrew original yet to be discovered. Also, there are disagreements on when the Book of Baruch was written.

What is a reality is the impact of the beautiful poetry on generations of readers of our First Reading (Baruch 5:1-9). It starts with the very reassuring line, "Jerusalem, take off your robe of mourning and misery; put on the splendor of glory from God forever." Yes, after the fall of Jerusalem, many longed for the rise of the great city.

Baruch expresses the same and echoes the words and imageries of earlier prophets on the return of the exiles on God's divine action. In particular, and as earlier similarly prophesied by Isaiah, Baruch states, "For God has commanded that every lofty mountain be made low, and that the age-old depths and gorges be filled to level ground, that Israel may advance secure in the glory of God." Our First Reading ends with, "For God is leading Israel in joy by the light of His glory, with his mercy and justice for company."

The reiteration of Baruch of earlier prophecies reinforces the conviction of God's promises to the people through the ages. It is like having a younger spokesperson emphasizing and renewing the unfailing hope one finds in God. In the **Hoping and Longing for the Coming of Jesus** in "mercy and justice" ... notwithstanding the actual date the Book was written.

The three Synoptic Gospels: Mark, Matthew and Luke all mention John the Baptist and his importance in preparing for the beginning of the public ministry of Jesus.

In today's Gospel Reading (Luke 3:1-6), we take note of Luke's attention to political and historical detail. He lists the political and religious leaders at the time John appears in the desert baptizing for repentance and for forgiveness of sins, preparing the way for God's salvation. Moreover, Luke shows that salvation is for all!

Clearly, John's proclamation of the coming of the Lord is a key theme of the Advent Season. To affirm this, Luke quotes Prophet Isaiah (Isaiah 40:3-5), "A voice of one crying out in the desert: Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths. Every valley shall be filled, and every mountain and hill shall be made low. The winding roads shall be made straight, and the rough ways made smooth, and all flesh shall see the salvation of God." Notably, Baruch echoes the same imagery of straightening of paths in our First Reading.

John's message to prepare the way for Jesus is a call for us all to do our part ... in preparing ourselves, in **Hoping and Longing for the Coming of Jesus**. Let us respond to John's call by repentance and by living reformed lives that reflect the coming of the Lord that others may recognize and consequently experience the fullness of joy. The joy of salvation that God desires for all!

A blessed 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of Advent to all!


