Spiritual Reflection - The Baptism of the Lord

Jesus' Baptism and Public Life by Fr. Lawrence Mendoza

On this last day of the Christmas Season, we celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, an account reported in each of the three Synoptic Gospels: Matthew, Mark and Luke. It is not directly narrated in John's Gospel, but it is broached in the testimony of John the Baptist in John 1:32 which states, "I saw the Spirit come down like a dove from the sky and remain upon him."

In short, all four Gospels tell us that Jesus was baptized and graced by the presence of the Triune God. God the Father in the voice saying, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased." The Holy Spirit descending upon Jesus and Jesus the Son as He starts His public life!

Undoubtedly, the Baptism of Jesus is an event that is of great significance. In fact, it is one of the Epiphanies of Jesus. We heard another Epiphany of Jesus last Sunday on His first appearance to the world through the Magi!

In today's Gospel (Luke 3:15-16, 21-22), John the Baptist addresses the confusion of the people who thought that John might be the Messiah. In response, John the Baptist says that he is baptizing with water, but "One mightier than I is coming ... He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire." That is, the type of baptism John performs is not yet a Christian baptism. It is a preparation for the Christian baptism that Jesus will commission His Apostles saying, "go, therefor, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit."

Today's Feast invites us to reflect on our own baptism through which, we also receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. Our original sin, all personal sins and punishment due to sin are taken away. It marks our official entry into the Church. We receive the identity as daughters and sons of God and are called to share in the mission to continue the ministry of Jesus!

As our Gospel Reading narrates the beginning of Jesus' public life ... His ministry ... our other readings give us an insight and style of His ministry.

Our First Reading (Isaiah 42:1-4, 6-7) is part of Isaiah's "Suffering Servant" prophecies. Isaiah announces the presence of a "servant" who is chosen by God and a source of delight for Him. God's spirit will be with this "servant" enabling him to bring forth justice gently rather than with noise and earthly power. Moreover, the "servant" will be a light to the nations and will bring about healing and salvation!

The refrain of our Responsorial Psalm (Psalm 29:1-4, 9-10) states, "The Lord will bless his people with peace." Thus, the prayer praising God's glory, power and greatness!

In our Second Reading (Acts 10:34-38), Peter proclaims the truth of Jesus' ministry. First, he tells those in the house of Cornelius of the impartiality of God's grace and the universality of Jesus' Lordship. Peter also narrates Jesus' baptism by John the Baptist and how God anoints Jesus with the Holy Spirit and power. Consequently, Jeus starts His ministry of doing good ... to bring about healing and salvation!

A blessed Feast of the Baptism of the Lord to all!
