

Spiritual Reflection – Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

The Power of the Word of God

Every Third Sunday in Ordinary Time is declared Sunday of the Word of God. Today's readings aptly narrate the Power of the Word of God. God's Word ... from both the Old and New Testaments ... tell us of the Word of God Incarnate, who is Jesus. Jesus has come to proclaim the Good News that God desires us to be one with Jesus in proclaiming God's glory!

In our First Reading (Nehemiah 8:2-a, 5-6, 8-10), we encounter Nehemiah, a lay civil leader in the time after the Babylonian exile. He was responsible for the restoration of the Temple in Jerusalem and the rebuilding of the city. During his time in office, the Word of God in a Book of the Law was "discovered." Today's passage describes Ezra, the priest-scribe, reading this Book of the Law to the people and interpreting it for all to understand. Hearing the Words of the Law brings tears to the people. The passage ends, "Today is holy to our Lord. Do not be saddened this day, for rejoicing in the Lord must be your strength."

Our Responsorial Psalm (Psalm 19:8, 9, 10, 15) echoes the effect that God's Word has on the people as expressed in our First Reading. Hearing and acting on the Word of God is refreshing, wisdom producing and a cause for rejoicing. And as the refrain states, "Your words, Lord are Spirit and life."

In the short version of our Second Reading (1 Corinthians 12:12-14, 27) St. Paul compares the Church, Christ's spiritual body, to the human body. Just as the human body is made up of different parts, all with a specific function and purpose, so is the Church is made up of many believers, all connected by the Holy Spirit. St. Paul explains that in one Spirit, we are all baptized into the one body of Christ.

Today's Gospel Reading (Luke 1:1-4; 4:14-21) combines two separate passages taken from the Gospel of Luke. First, we hear the opening verses where Luke establishes the purpose of his Gospel. He puts into writing what has been proclaimed by eyewitnesses concerning the life, ministry, death and resurrection of Jesus so that Theophilus may "realize the certainty of the teachings he has received." Yes, Luke is writing to a specific person Theophilus (meaning "lover of God") but the word "Theophilus" may very well be the phrase "Dear Reader" referring to us all ... readers and listeners of the Word of God!

Our Gospel Reading then leaps to Chapter 4 and we next hear that Jesus is in His hometown of Nazareth, in the synagogue on the Sabbath, which is said to be His custom. This is clearly an important clue that Jesus is a faithful Jew. Jesus is handed a scroll that contains the words of the Prophet Isaiah. He reads it aloud ... a description of His mission ... then announces, "Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing."

Undoubtedly, being a part of a community of believers, a Church headed by Jesus, unites us with the Word of God. In our Liturgical Celebrations, the Word of God is proclaimed, and the priest presider interprets it for us with the exhortation that we put the Word into practice! May we use our respective gifts of the Holy Spirit to do our roles and together share the Word of God (be it in words or deeds) with others ... in proclaiming God's glory!

A blessed Sunday of the Word of God to all!!
